The final recital will take place on the Aeolian-Skinner organ in Hill Auditorium at 8:00 PM, with introduction at 7:40 PM.

Update on Austin organ renovation at St. Paul's Lutheran Church

A first phase of the project has been completed, involving removal, repair, and cleaning of most of the pipes, and the replacing them in the organ chambers. In addition, the chambers themselves have been cleaned. The work is being carried out by John-Paul Buzard Organ Builders of Champaign, IL.

Phase 2 entails removal of the organ console, refurbishing it, and upgrading the combination action and other control systems. Due to supply chain issues, this phase will be delayed until early 2023. Thus the organ will be playable again through the end of this calendar year. The organ will not be playable in January and February of 2023. Plans are for completion of the console project by March, in plenty of time for Easter.
